A NOTE FROM TRINIDAD

For as long as I can remember, Hear West Theatre has been a place where big musicals feel intimate and personal. The cast could have sixty people and it still feels like they're speaking directly to you.

Thanks to the tenacity and passion of our founders, the idea of having our own building became a reality. We began considering how we could activate this facility further to **create more creative opportunities for our participants**, **audiences**, **and youth**. 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


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
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
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GET TO KNOW THE CAST





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


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
